SHOWER BETTER TO SAVE WATER & MONEY



Free WaterSense Labeled Showerheads

The shower is a place where we clean up, cool off, relax, and where we do some of our best thinking and singing. While we are not going to remind you to wash behind your ears, we would like you, in observance of EPA-declared Shower Better Month, to consider this: long showers are costly to the environment and your wallet.

On average, a shower lasts about eight minutes and uses more than 16 gallons of water! Across the United States, 1.2 trillion gallons of water are used each year just for showering. However, there are ways to “Shower Better” to save on your water utility and electric bills and conserve the planet’s precious resource.

HOW TO SHOWER BETTER:

Shorten Showers: Adopt the 5-Minute Shower Challenge

A 5-minute shower saves 10 – 25 gallons of water per shower! Shortening your shower time, even by just *one minute*, can save 550 gallons of water per year.

Ways to shorten your shower:

- Use a shower timer
- Turn the water off while lathering up and shampooing/conditioning
- Create a 5-minute playlist to play while you shower
- Take a lukewarm or cold shower to encourage getting out faster

Use WaterSense Labeled Showerheads

- Replace your showerheads with WaterSense labeled showerheads. It will save the average family about 2,700 gallons of water per year (equivalent to washing 88 loads of laundry).
- According to the EPA, if you use a WaterSense labeled showerhead, you use less water while maintaining sufficient spray force and spray coverage while showering.
